Subj: APPROVED CULTURAL AWARENESS, AMERICAN HISTORY AND NATIONAL SECURITY POLICY COURSES

- 1. Per references (a) through (c), Navy midshipmen are required to take a 3 credit "Cultural Awareness" course related to regional studies, world culture or religion. This course shall have emphasis on Third World, Far East or Southwest Asia regions. Courses focusing on Western European, European and North American cultural studies do not meet this requirement. The cultural awareness course is not currently required of Marine Corps midshipmen.
- 2. Per references (a) and (c), midshipmen not enrolled in the Nursing program are required to take a 3 credit "American History" or "National Security Policy" course related to U.S. military history, world military history, U.S. National Security policy or combinations of these topics.
- 3. Enclosure (1) lists approved American Military History and National Security Policy courses while enclosure (2) lists approved Cultural Awareness courses. NROTC Unit, Penn State advisors may determine, with chain of command concurrence, if courses not listed in enclosures (1) or (2) meet reference (a) through (c) requirements/intent in support of student academic plans. NROTC Unit, Penn State advisors shall recommend changes to enclosures (1) and/or (2) as new classes become available.
- 4. NROTC midshipmen can earn a minor in Military Studies through Penn State by completing their required NROTC classes as well as 6 additional credits focused on military history, political science, and cultural awareness. All classes listed in enclosure (1) meet the Military Studies minor requirement. Enclosure (2) lists courses that meet the Military Studies Minor requirement as well as additional courses that meet the NROTC Cultural Awareness requirement but DO NOT meet the Military Studies Minor requirements.
